

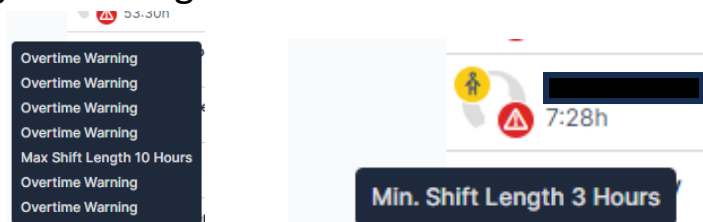
Shift warnings will show on the schedule editor based on the configuration below (updated 1/8/25).

Shift warnings will show up as described below:

- 1) When doing the schedule in the schedule editor, the first warning will show was a red exclamation point on there name. Note: Minors are marked by the yellow person.



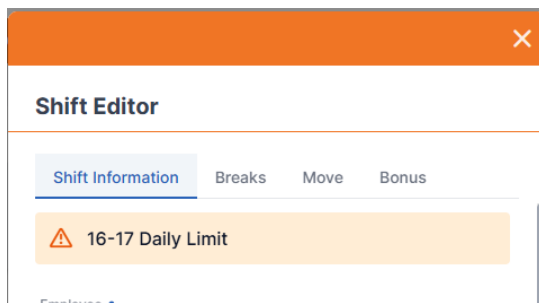
Note: You can hover over the red exclamation point to see what warnings are being broken. Here are a few examples:



- 2) They can then click on the shift warnings tab to see which employee and which shift is breaking a rule and the description of the rule it is breaking.

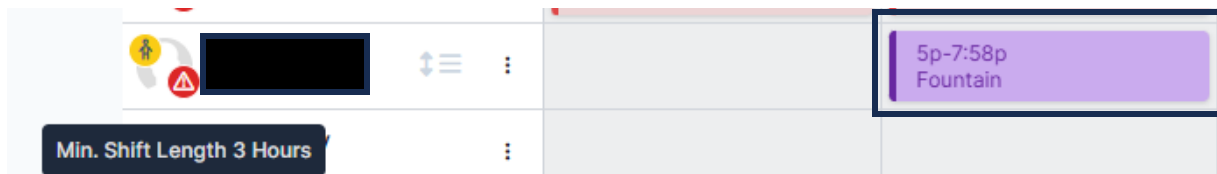

- 3) On the shift warning page, they can edit the shift using the pencil icon. This will open the shift editor box. Here you will again see the shift warning that it is breaking, and you will be able to edit it until the yellow bar disappears.



Note: Warnings will show both for a scheduled shift AND a worked shift. Any exclamation points should be reviewed by management before posting payroll to ensure all warnings have been verified and fixed as needed.
